Photography and Videography

- Personalize your wedding album with an engagement photo taken at a special location such as the place you first met or had your first date.
- Splashier video graphics and slick editing makes tapes look less like home movies and more like Hollywood productions. There's even a technique called posterization (which freezes the picture and then "colorizes" it).
- Adding still photos of your childhood at the beginning of the videotape and snapshots of your honeymoon at the end creates a complete feel.

Your to-do list

This month you should:

- Select florist.
- Book photographer and/or videographer.

What you should know about florists...

Whether it's a single long-stemmed red rose or a bouquet of daisies, flowers transform a wedding. You need a florist that understands your tastes and desires. In order to find that florist, you should:

- Make sure the designer can create a motif to compliment you (the Bride), the Bridal gown, the Bridesmaid's color, the ceremony and reception.
- Ask to see actual photographs or samples of the florist's past work — not airbrushed photos from an FTD book.
- If it will be hot when you get married, watch out for heat-sensitivity. Some flowers wilt or turn brown. Make sure your florist provides you with a floral selection that withstands the heat or uses an "anti-transpirant" spray to seal in the moisture.
